Davidson County's Wastewater Collection System Permit # WQCS00361

Davidson County operates & maintains approximately 35 miles of public sewer mains and five wastewater pumping stations in the northwest quadrant of the county. The wastewater received by the County's collection system discharges to the Winston-Salem/Forsyth County Utilities' Lower Muddy Creek Wastewater Treatment Plant located in Forsyth County.

Currently, seventy-five percent of the wastewater discharged to the County collection system originates from residences. Approximately twenty percent of the wastewater volume is received from public schools and the remaining five percent is commercial use.


